Legislators will travel to the US to meet with migrants.

Monday, February 6, 2017.

Senators from the Monarch group and the North American Commission on Foreign Relations will travel to the cities of Phoenix, Arizona, and Sacramento, California, from 10 to 16 this month, to meet with Mexican migrants.

Armando Ríos Piter, Ángel Benjamín Robles Montoya, Gabriela Cuevas Barrón, Blanca Alcalá Ruiz, Jesús Casillas Romero and Juan Carlos Romero Hicks will hold a series of meetings with migrant leaders and authorities, including Mayor Greg Stanton in Phoenix and later with David Adame, of Chicanos for the Cause.

They will also attend a meeting with Representative Tony Rivero, chair of the Legislative Committee on International and Local Affairs and with the Mayor of Tucson, Jonathan Rothschild.

On February 11 they will hold the second forum to listen to the concerns and proposals of some 50 migrants through four sessions moderated by opinion leaders: SB1070; Myths and realities of deportation; Voluntary repatriation and expectations of our nationals about Mexico.

In Sacramento, Feb. 15, lawmakers on the Foreign Relations Commission, chaired by Senator Marcela Guerra Castillo, will meet with Secretary of the California Environmental Protection Agency Mathew Rodriguez and Californian entrepreneurs.

On February 16, senators will meet with California State Senator Kevin de Leon and later with Anthony Rendon, president of the California State Assembly, with members of the Cienvica Cien Amigos organization.

They will also meet with the Secretary of the California Energy Commission, Robert Weisenmiller, and a group of so-called dreamers.
