

"Increase in gasoline, derived from combating climate change"

The elimination of subsidies to fuels and which has resulted in the increase in the price of gasoline in the country, responds to the commitments made by the Mexican government with the international community as part of actions to mitigate the effects of climate change, Said the head of the Secretariat of Environment and Natural Resources (Semarnat), Rafael Pacchiano. During his speech at the opening of the Second Summit of Climate Change in the Americas, the Mexican official indicated that with the gradual elimination of this subsidy Have generated more than 18 billion pesos for taxes that will be used in the implementation of a new market model based on clean energy. Mexico also seeks to integrate into the clean energy market that already exists in Canada and the United States; In that sense, Governor of Jalisco, Aristóteles Sandoval, the director of the California Energy Resources Conservation and Conservation Commission, Robert Weisenmiller signed a Memorandum of Understanding this Tuesday to promote projects that reduce greenhouse gases and encourage the use of clean energy.
